

Graphical Tabulation of Grades (GToG) Maxey



To earn the full 20 extra credit points.

1. The GToG must be kept current after each assignment is graded and returned.
2. The GToG will be collected three or four times, at random, throughout the semester. To earn the portion of the points it must be complete and available. (keep it in your notebook and bring each day to class)
3. The earned points will be added to your final grade at the end of the semester and only if the complete original GToG is handed in.

How to fill in your GToG

1. Draw a colored line at the percentage you would like to earn for a grade this semester. Eighty percent is an attainable goal for every student. Though some will set a higher goal.
2. Each time you receive a graded paper record the information in the appropriate column. (ie. Date, Points received, Points possible, Name of assignment.)
3. The first assignment will have the same starting point.
4. The following grades will create two separate graphs. One will be a graph, which will show each assignment individually (use another color to indicate the corresponding graph) and the second graph will show the cumulative/weighted effects of all the grades. (also in another color)

Math and Graphing

1. Using column 3 for the example figure the percentage of the assignment by taking the Current Points received (47) and divide it by the Current points possible (50) then multiply it by (100) to get a percentage for that assignment.
2. Next if you look at the total points possible and the overall percentage of all the assignments together you will end up with the current grade you are earning in the class.
3. Using column 3 again you will see that the Total Points Received (TPR) is a cumulative number of all preceding grades earned. $23+32=79$. The Total Points Possible (TPP) is a cumulative of all the assignment points which could have been earned. $25+35=85$.
4. Finally to get a current percentage or the grade you are earning in the class now you will take the Total Points Received (TPR) and divide it by the Total Points Possible (TPP) and multiply it by 100 to get a percent. These points can now be plotted and graphed to give you a visual of your current and past performance in the class.
